Active 400-year-old Forges in the Heart of the City

Experience crafts, history, and fine dining in one of Sweden's best-preserved 17th-century environments! The open-air museum contains several well-preserved houses from Sweden's first smithing manufactory from the 1650s, as well as newer buildings from the 18th and 19th centuries. Most of the buildings are now occupied by artisans and restaurants, but you can also visit the museum smithy to get a glimpse into the lives of the 17th-century smiths, or let the children play their way back to the 17th century in the play smithy.

The open-air museum is available all year round with several outdoor exhibitions on display, but the artisans and restaurants all have their individual opening hours. The museum smithy and play smithy are only open during the summer season and on market days. The area hosts a charming, traditional Christmas market every year.

The Munktell Museum – over 190 years of Swedish industrial history.

Welcome to the Munktell Museum – an exciting museum for the whole family and all ages. The tractor-loving child, the motor enthusiast, the historian interested or the construction worker – everyone can find great joy in the museum's unique collection of large machines, technical products and the fascinating story about Johan Theofron Munktell: The founder of Munktell's mechanical workshops, that later became Volvo Construction Equipment.

The Munktell Museum is owned and operated by Volvo CE, located amongst beautiful scenery in the middle of Munktellstaden in Eskilstuna, an old industrial district with a lot of history, right next to the Eskilstuna river. The premises of 3000 sqm were previously space for engine testing, construction and machining but is now home to over 90 objects such as Bm- and Volvo-tractors, engines, construction machines etc.

Come with us to one of Sörmlands best-preserved castles and hear the whispers from centuries past. Come closer. Listen carefully and you'll almost hear the clang of pots and pans as the servants prepare the evening meal. What do you think the family of the estate would be having for dinner?

The first mention in writing of this beautiful estate was in a letter from 1328. But discoveries and graves from the bronze and iron age indicate that people flourished on these lands long before then. And although no one has lived at the manor since the 1980s, there's a real sense of life about the place.
